Description of the Type Design Change:

Installation of Anti-Torque Extension Adjustment System in accordance with Paravion Technology, Inc. Master Drawing List No. DL-407PX-100, Rev. B, dated January 4, 1997, or later FAA approved revision.

Limitations and Conditions:

1. This approval should not be extended to rotorcraft of this model on which other previously approved modifications are incorporated unless it is determined that the interrelationship between this change and any of those other previously approved modifications, including changes in type design, will introduce no adverse effect upon the airworthiness of that rotorcraft.
2. A copy of this Certificate and Instructions for Continued Airworthiness, which define inspection and maintenance requirements, Document No. PR-407PX-120M, Rev. O dated January 28, 1998 or later FAA approved revision is required and must be maintained as part of the permanent records for the modified rotorcraft.
3. If the holder agrees to permit another person to use this certificate to alter the product, the holder shall give the other person written evidence of that permission.

This certificate and the supporting data which is the basis for approval shall remain in effect until surrendered, suspended, revoked, or a termination date is otherwise established by the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration.

Any alteration of this certificate is punishable by a fine of not exceeding \$1,000, or imprisonment not exceeding 3 years, or both.

This certificate may be transferred in accordance with FAR 21.47.

Please note the following statement that has been included in the Limitations section of the STC Certificate.

“If the holder agrees to permit another person to use this certificate to alter the product, the holder shall give the other person written evidence of that permission.”

This is a new requirement that was enacted in the Federal Aviation Act of 1996 (Public Law 104-264), section 403. Section 44704 of 49 U. S. C. 40101 was amended stating: “If the holder of a supplemental type certificate agrees to permit another person to use the certificate to modify an aircraft, aircraft engine, propeller, or appliance, the holder shall provide the other person with written evidence, in a form acceptable to the Administrator, of that agreement. A person may change an aircraft, aircraft engine, propeller, or appliance based on a supplemental type certificate only if the person requesting the change is the holder of the supplemental type certificate or has permission of the holder to make the change.”

The new requirement is intended to give STC holders an avenue of recourse in cases where their technical package is used without permission as the basis to make alterations on other products.

If the STC holder wishes to make his STC available to others, he must provide a written permission statement to each applicable persons making the alterations based on the STC. If an STC holder is making the alteration to their own product, the permission statements do not apply

The permission statement, should as a minimum contain:

1. a written statement of the agreement specifying the product(s) to be altered;
2. The STC number;
3. the person(s) who is being given consent to use the STC.

This office will be adding the statement to all multiple STC Certificates as they hare amended as well as to all new multiple STCs.

This requirement will not be retroactively applied to STCs installed prior to this notice, but the permission statement is required for all STC applications from this point on, even if the STC document does not contain the notification.
